It is not clear whether Mozart and Beethoven ever met, but what is known is that Beethoven wanted to take lessons with Mozart. However his mother suddenly fell ill and he left Vienna after just two weeks. By the time Beethoven returned, Mozart was already dead. The fact that Beethoven, Mozart's junior by 14 years, loved Mozart's music is apparent in the various compositions he wrote based, among other things, on Mozart's operas. The variations on the aria "Là ci darem la mano" from Don Giovanni follow Mozart's Sonata in G major in Saturday's concert. Beethoven's Piano Trio No. 7, one of the greatest of its kind, will then be performed. Beethoven dedicated it to his student Archduke Rudolph of Austria.

Johannes Brahms	Piano trio No. 1 in B major, op. 8
Walter Rabl	Quartet op. 1 for violin, cello, clarinet and piano

The piano trio in B major op. 8 is both the first and last piano trio by Johannes Brahms. He wrote two versions of it – the first in 1854 and the second in 1889. The second version is best known today, so we associate the trio more with the mature Brahms than with his 21-year-old self. After this romantic masterpiece of chamber music, the ensemble will play Quartet op. 1 by the Viennese composer Walter Rabl (1873-1940). With thes Quartet the 23-year-old Rabl won the prestigious Viennese Musicians' Association competition for young composers in 1896. Brahms was honorary president of the association and a member of the jury, and his recommendation led to several of Rabl's works being published by Brahms' publisher Simrock.
